## SUMMARY

### Synopsis of Senate Bill 180

Senate Bill 180 appropriates \$600 thousand from the general fund to the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center for the student mentoring program.

This bill does not contain an effective date and, as a result, would go into effect 90 days after the Legislature adjourns, or May 15, 2024, if enacted.

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$600 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY25 shall revert to the general fund.

## SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

This appropriation will provide government training for high school students and minority student services.
