DECLARATION OF RAUL BURCIAGA

1. My name is Raul Burciaga. I am over the age of eighteen years old, am otherwise competent to testify to the matters contained in this Declaration and have personal knowledge of the same.

2. I am the Director of the Legislative Council Service (“LCS”) for the New Mexico Legislature.

3. LCS is charged with arranging for the maintenance of copies of video recordings of legislative proceedings and is the custodian of those recordings. The webcasts/ webstreams of these proceedings are maintained by a third party, SLIQ , under contract with the LCS., as the server capacity required exceeds that available onsite with the LCS. Recordings have been made of House and Senate Committee meetings and floor sessions since the 2017 session. They are maintained on the SLIQ server for at least five years. They can be accessed on the New Mexico Legislative Council Service website, nmlegis.gov by clicking on the link to Webcast and then choosing the date of the Committee Hearing or Floor Session.

4. These recordings are routinely made as part of the ordinary business of the New Mexico Legislature. They are verbatim recordings of the committee hearings and floor sessions.

8. I affirm on this 15th day of September, 2023, under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of New Mexico, that the foregoing is true and correct.



New Mexico Regions Percent Population Change: 2010 to 2020



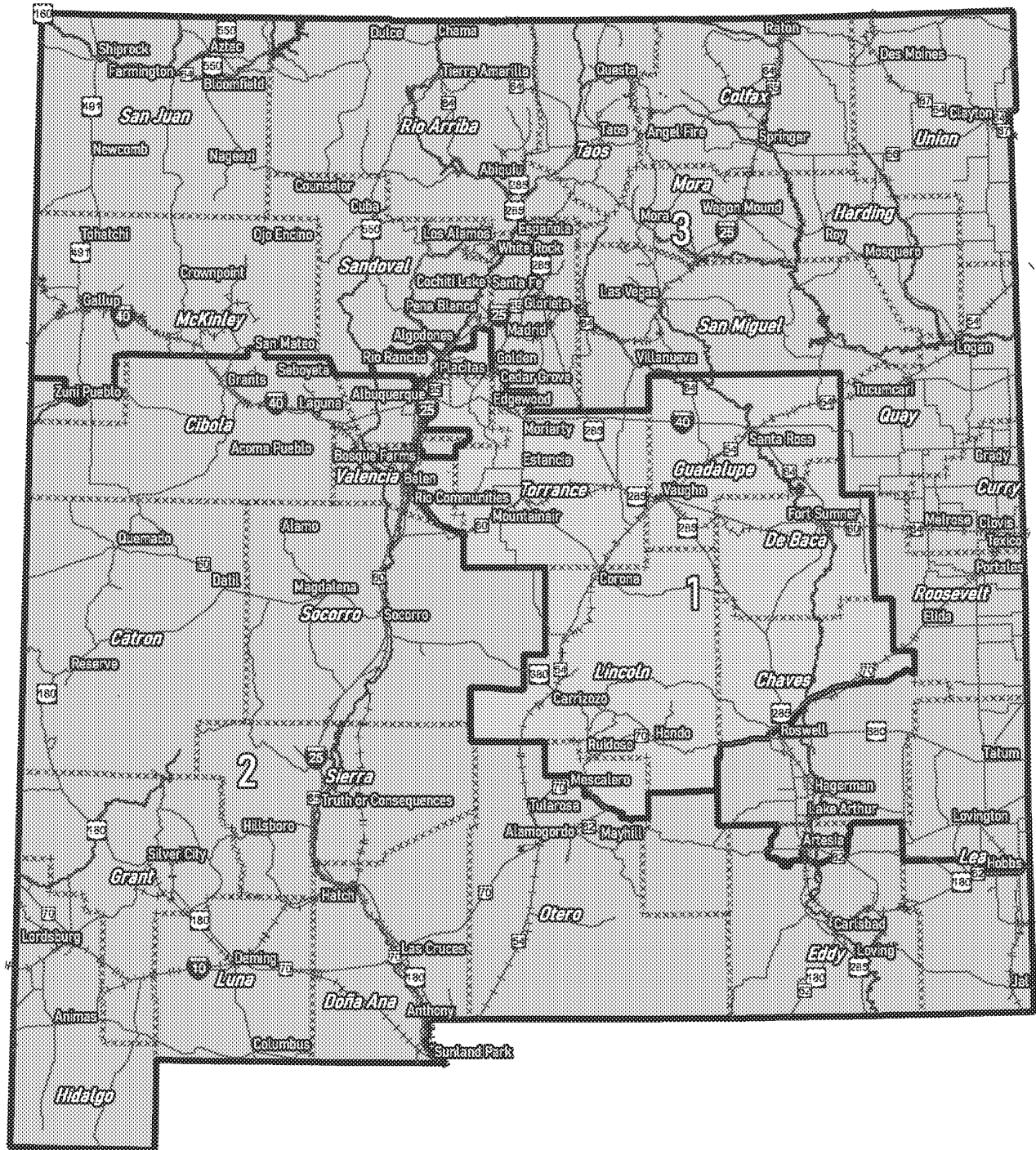

Greater Albuquerque

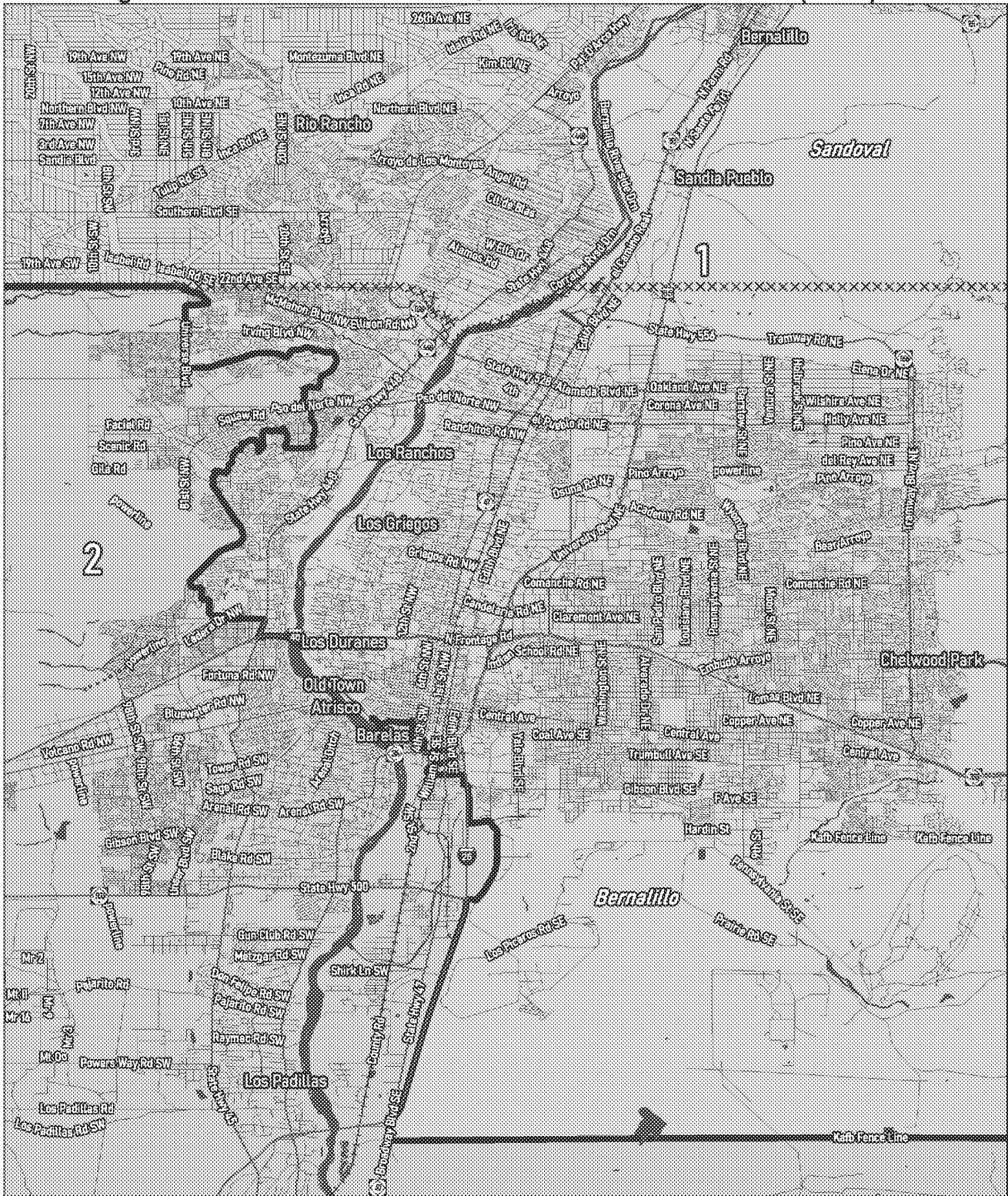
