# June 2018 Quarterly Update

### **Ouarterly Status of Outstanding Capital Funds**

- As of June 2018, approximately \$433.4 million from all funding sources for 1,406 projects remains outstanding, including \$58.5 million of earmarked fund balances for water (\$25.9 million), colonias (\$15 million), and tribal (\$17.6 million) infrastructure projects. Additionally, about \$197 million remains outstanding from supplemental severance tax bonds for public schools.
- Since the March 2018 quarterly report, 298 projects closed and approximately \$83.8 million was expended or reverted. These figures include 78 projects that were not fully expended, but closed due to reauthorization during the 2018 legislative session. The \$35.6 million of reauthorized balances will return on the next quarterly report. Excluding reauthorizations, 220 projects closed and about \$48.2 million was spent or reverted.
- STBs make up 56 percent of the total unexpended balance, while GOBs account for 32.3 percent, and other state funds (OSF) 11.9 percent.

### **<u>\$1 Million and Greater Report</u>**

LFC staff tracks all capital appropriations of \$1 million or more, for 180 projects which totaled \$918.7 million at the end of June 2018. The unexpended balances for those projects is \$376.7 million, or 87 percent, of all unexpended funds. Since the March 2018 report, 21 appropriations totaling \$67.8 million were fully expended or reverted. Additionally, 16 of these major projects with balances of \$29.4 million were reauthorized.

### HIGHLIGHTS OF SELECT PROJECTS

#### Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department (16A2236 to 17B4043)

• Line 142, \$1 million, (2016 STB; 2017 reauthorization), to the Oil Conservation Division (OCD) for site improvements and to plan, design, construct, equip and furnish the oil conservation division district office in Artesia. The agency reports that a land purchase agreement is pending, however land acquisition may not be permitted by the appropriation language.

**Economic Development Department** (06-0227 to 07-6194 to 10-1299 to 14-2266 to 16A4032 to 17B4065)

• Line 221, \$5 million (2006 STB, multiple reauthorizations), to acquire land and water rights and for infrastructure improvements for Cannon Air Force Base. Originally appropriated in 2006, the project has been reauthorized five times and still has a balance of \$805.6 thousand. A vertical easement to provide security to Cannon and the Melrose Air Force Range was recently finalized.

### **Public Education Department** (14-2176 and 16A2635 to 18C4137)

• Lines 244 and 245, \$2.5 million and \$5 million (2014 and 2016 Public School Capital Outlay Fund), appropriations for pre-kindergarten classrooms statewide have made minimal progress. The 2014 appropriation expired at the end of FY18 with a remaining balance of \$1.8 million.

#### 2014 Senior Center Projects (multiple appropriations)

• Line 8, \$16.4 million (2014 GOB), for code compliance, renovations, equipment, and vehicles ended FY18 with \$2.4 million unexpended pending closeout and final reimbursements.


- Four years after \$83.5 million was authorized for 191 water projects statewide in the 2014 capital outlay bill, \$12.5 million (15 percent) was unspent. As of the end of June, 81 percent of the projects were either closed or were deauthorized during the 2016 special session due to inactivity (23 projects totaling \$1.7 million). Thirteen projects closed in the last quarter.
- Most of the unspent funding is from 30 projects totaling nearly \$26.8 million (32 percent of the total) that have been reauthorized to change the purpose or extend the time to spend the funds beyond the original four year period. Thirteen of the 30 reauthorized projects are now closed, and the remaining 17 projects had balances of \$11 million at the end of FY18.
- The largest single project in the package \$11 million to improve and expand Bradner Dam still has a balance of \$7.5 million, accounting for 60 percent of the total unspent funds. This project was significantly delayed when the decision was made to replace, rather than repair, the dam. Construction began in the spring of 2018, and the 2018 reauthorization bill extended the reversion date through FY20.

### Authorized but Unissued Status (Attachment A)

- Following the June 2018 bond sale, 60 projects authorized for \$18.3 million remain unissued, including \$11.5 million from a 2016 appropriation to the Local Economic Development Fund and 59 projects authorized in 2018.
- The June sale included five projects totaling \$319.8 thousand that were removed from the March 2018 authorized but unissued list; bonds were sold for two of these projects but three others are now expired after the certification deadline passed at the end of FY18.
- In the summer of 2016, BOF reassigned funding for projects if funds were not encumbered or if there were no expenditures within 18 months following issuance of severance tax bonds. This action affected 69 projects totaling \$6.4 million. The June bond sale included nine of these projects totaling \$601.8 thousand, leaving 14 projects totaling \$834.7 thousand on the reassigned list.

### Status of Earmarked Funds (Attachments B, C and D)

• The chart below summarizes, by year, the percent of all unexpended awards from earmarked funds (water project fund, colonias infrastructure fund, and tribal infrastructure fund). The water project fund's 2017 STB distribution was suspended as part of solvency efforts during the special legislative session.



**Note:** Data for quarterly and \$1 million or greater reports is derived from CPMS, which is operated and maintained by DFA. Data is updated quarterly by state agencies and monthly by local entities responsible for oversight of the projects and includes expenditures, project status, milestones achieved last quarter, and projected milestones.
