November 2019 Quarterly Update

Ouarterly Status of Outstanding Capital Funds

- As of November 2019, approximately \$1.8 billion from all funding sources for 3,135 projects remains outstanding, including \$87.3 million of earmarked fund balances for water (\$33.9 million), colonias (\$24.4 million), and tribal (\$25.8 million) infrastructure projects. Additionally, about \$275 million remains outstanding from supplemental severance tax bonds for public schools.
- More than half of the unexpended balance is from 2019 appropriations, over 1,600, totaling \$961.2 million, with \$627.4 million unspent from appropriations in 2009 through 2018.
- Since the June 2019 quarterly report, 41 projects closed and approximately \$3.3 million was expended or reverted.
- About 18 percent of the total unexpended balance is from STBs, GOBs account for 21 percent, other state funds (OSF) are 26 percent, and general fund (GF) appropriations are 62 percent.

\$1 Million and Greater Report

LFC staff tracks all capital appropriations of \$1 million or more for 351 projects totaling \$1.5 billion as of November 12, 2019. The unexpended balances for those projects is just over \$1 billion, or 74 percent, of all unexpended funds. Since the March 2019 report, 7 appropriations totaling \$58 million were fully expended or reverted.

HIGHLIGHTS OF SELECT PROJECTS

Department of Information Technology

• Lines 87 and 91, \$35.4 million, (2015, 2016, 2018, 2019 STB, MRF, and GF) for upgrading statewide radio infrastructure, including P25 efforts, has a balance of \$23 million, or 65 percent, outstanding. For FY21 in the agency's infrastructure capital improvement plan (ICIP), the agency requested an additional \$40 million.

Higher Education Department

- Line 230, \$2 million (2016 GOB), to pave parking lots and improve signage at Mesa Community College, will be delayed until April 2020 due to concerns about the weather. The project, appropriated in 2016, has a \$1.8 million balance.
- Line 243, \$1.5 million (2016 GOB), for roofing and infrastructure improvements at Santa Fe Community College, has completed roofing repairs and also completed a waste water treatment plant feasibility study which was approved by HED. A balance of \$1.1 million remains.

New Mexico School for the Deaf

• Line 317, \$2 million (2016 GOB), for Delgado Hall renovations, completed this quarter.



Authorized but Unissued Status (Attachment A)

• As of August, only three projects authorized for \$80 thousand remain unissued. All of the projects received appropriations in 2018.

Status of Earmarked Funds (Attachments B, C and D)

• The chart below summarizes, by year, the percent of all unexpended awards from earmarked funds (water project fund, colonias infrastructure fund, and tribal infrastructure fund). The water project fund's 2017 STB distribution was suspended as part of solvency efforts during the special legislative session.
