17	Section 2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Contractual

19	A. "common household member" means an adult who
20	enters into a contractual common household with another;
21	B. "contractual common household" means the
22	exclusive legal union of two adults to maximize domestic
23	benefits and commit to shared domestic responsibilities; and
