### SUMMARY

#### Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 563 enacts a new section of law intended to clarify the methods of establishing extraterritorial zoning authority. The bill clarifies that a class A county and a municipality may establish concurrent extraterritorial zoning authority by procedures established in existing law or through the use of joint powers agreements.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Senate Bill 563 makes no appropriations.

### RELATIONSHIP

Senate Bill 563 is related to House Bill 416, which amends Section 3-7-3 NMSA 1978 to restore the ability of a municipality to annex territory within a class A county with a population of over 300,000 persons without the approval of the board of county commissioners for that county.
