Senate Joint Memorial 32, as amended by the Senate Indian and Cultural Affairs Committee, adds the governors of Arizona and Utah to the list of recipients to whom this memorial will be transmitted.

Synopsis of Original Bill

Senate Joint Memorial 32 expresses appreciation to the Navajo Code Talkers Association and calls upon the United States Congress to provide funding for a Navajo Code Talker Museum and Veterans' Center.

The memorial also calls for copies to be transmitted to the President of the Navajo Nation, the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council, the New Mexico congressional delegation, the Navajo Code Talkers Association, and the Governor.
