#### Synopsis of Bill

House Memorial 16 proclaims February 18, 2013 to be “Chaparral Day” in the House of Representatives.

### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Chaparral is an unincorporated, census-designated place, located in Dona Ana and Otero Counties and situated next to the White Sands Missile Range and Fort Bliss. It is the largest colonia in New Mexico with a population of 14,631 (2010 federal census). It faces problems of inadequate infrastructure and exemplifies the difficulties faced by colonias. Despite these difficulties, it continues striving for excellence and celebrates educational opportunities in the Gadsden Independent Schools and Dona Ana Community College.
