## SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Mary Thom was one of the founders and editor of Ms. Magazine, a magazine that brought the feminist movement into homes in the Unites States beginning in the 1970s. As political editor, Thom ranked politicians’ commitment to feminist and progressive ideas.

Upon leaving Ms. Magazine in 1992, Thom co-founded the Women’s Media Center with Gloria Steinem, Jane Fonda, and Robin Morgan. The Women’s Media Center focuses on advocacy, political campaigns, media and leadership training, ensuring that women are powerfully and accurately represented. The center is recognizing Thom by instituting the "Mary Thom Art of Editing Award" and awarding it to her posthumously.

Mary Thom passed away in a motorcycle accident on April 26, 2013, her death was noted as an enormous blow to the women's movement by her fellow co-founders.
