#### **SUMMARY**

#### Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 261 appropriates \$105 thousand from the general fund to the Northern New Mexico state school (NNMC) to create a veteran's center on the Espanola to provide assistance in the transition from military to civilian and student life.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

As drafted, the appropriation of \$105 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY15 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 4 of the House Appropriations and Finance (HAFC) committee substitute for HB 2 currently contains an appropriation for \$125 thousand for NNMC to create a veterans center on the Espanola campus. SB 261 duplicates this appropriation.

### Senate Bill 261 – Page 2

Both SB 261 and the appropriation in HB 2 are new appropriations for FY15.

## **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

HED notes the appropriation contained in this bill would be used for training of staff and contracting for services related to veterans' benefits, including counseling on education and health benefits for approximately 20 hours per week. This would help veterans returning from recent military campaigns to receive services on the campus, rather than wait for a Veteran's Administration representative from Taos to schedule services at NNMC, according to HED.

NNMC has a Student Veterans Office in the Advisement Center of the Espanola Campus

#### **DUPLICATION**

This bill duplicates HB 282.

## **TECHNICAL ISSUES**

SB 261 would appropriate funds to the "Northern New Mexico state school," now known as Northern New Mexico College. Article VII, Section 11 of the state's constitution identifies NNMC as the "northern New Mexico state school."
