# Synopsis of Bill

Senate Memorial 18 declares February 3, 2014 "Patrick Grange ALS Awareness Day," in the Senate, to increase public awareness of ALS patients' circumstances and the terrible impact the disease has on the patient, their family and the community.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No fiscal impact.

#### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), better known as Lou Gehrig's disease is a fatal neurodegenerative disease that eventually causes the patient to become a functional quadriplegic, having no affect on a patient's mental capacity; and forcing them to remain alert and aware of the inevitable outcome.

Patrick Grange was a former University of New Mexico and Albuquerque High soccer star who was diagnosed with ALS at age 28, making him the youngest ALS patient in New Mexico. Despite his hard fought battle, Grange died of ALS on March 10, 2012.
