The memorial further commends the New Mexico Corrections Department (NMCD) for commitment to increasing public safety by lowering recidivism.

# SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The memorial states that on February 2-4, 1980 the Penitentiary of New Mexico was the sight of what remains one of the most savage and deadly prison riots in this nation's history due to overcrowding, lack of programs, poor living conditions, and unsatisfactory food. During the riot 33 inmates were killed and ninety were injured. Fourteen corrections officers were also held hostage, assaulted, or injured by rioting inmates.
