15	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. It is proposed to amend Article 6, Section 34
17	of the constitution of New Mexico to read:
18	"The office of any justice or judge subject to the
19	provisions of [Section 33 of] Article 6, <u>Section 33</u> of this
20	constitution becomes vacant on January l immediately following
21	the general election at which the justice or judge is rejected
22	by more than forty-three percent of those voting on the
23	question of [his] retention or rejection or on January l
24	immediately following the date [he] <u>the justice or judge</u> fails
25	to file a declaration of candidacy for the retention of [his]

1 the justice's or judge's office in the general election at 2 which the justice or judge would be subject to retention or 3 rejection by the electorate. Otherwise, the office becomes vacant upon the date of the death, resignation or removal by 4 5 impeachment of the justice or judge.
