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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. Section 21-1-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1970,
16	Chapter 9, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
17	"21-1-2. MATRICULATION AND TUITION FEES
18	A. Except as otherwise provided in this section and
19	in [Section 21-1-4.3 NMSA 1978] <u>the Legislative Lottery Tuition</u>
20	Scholarship Act, the boards of regents of the university of New
21	Mexico, New Mexico state university, New Mexico highlands
22	university, western New Mexico university, eastern New Mexico
23	university, New Mexico military institute and New Mexico
24	institute of mining and technology shall establish and charge
25	matriculation fees and tuition fees as follows:

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1 each student shall be charged a (1) 2 matriculation fee of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) upon 3 enrolling in each institution; each student who is a resident of New 4 (2) 5 Mexico shall be charged a tuition fee of not less than twenty dollars (\$20.00) a year; 6 7 (3) each student who is not a resident of New Mexico shall be charged a tuition fee of not less than fifty 8 9 dollars (\$50.00) a year; each student shall be charged a tuition 10 (4) fee of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) for each summer 11 12 session; and each student may be charged a tuition fee 13 (5) 14 for extension courses. Except as otherwise provided in this section and 15 Β. in [Section 21-1-4.3 NMSA 1978] the Legislative Lottery Tuition 16 Scholarship Act, the board of regents of northern New Mexico 17 college shall establish and charge each student a matriculation 18 fee and a tuition fee. 19 20 C. The board of regents of each institution may establish and grant gratis scholarships to students who are 21 residents of New Mexico in an amount not to exceed the 22 matriculation fee or tuition and fees, or both. These 23 scholarships are in addition to the lottery tuition 24 scholarships authorized in [Section 21-1-4.3 NMSA 1978] <u>the</u> 25 .198163.1

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1 Legislative Lottery Tuition Scholarship Act and shall be 2 granted to the full extent of available funds before lottery 3 tuition scholarships are granted. The number of scholarships established and granted pursuant to this subsection shall not 4 exceed three percent of the preceding fall semester enrollment 5 in each institution and shall not be established and granted 6 7 for summer sessions. The president of each institution shall 8 select and recommend to the board of regents of the 9 institution, as recipients of scholarships, students who possess good moral character and satisfactory initiative, 10 scholastic standing and personality. Beginning with the fall 11 12 semester of 2010, a minimum of one-half of the gratis scholarships established and granted by each board of regents 13 14 each year shall be granted on the basis of financial need, and beginning with the fall semester of 2011, a minimum of two-15 thirds of the gratis scholarships established and granted by 16 each board of regents each year shall be granted on the basis 17 of financial need. 18

D. The board of regents or governing board of each institution set out in this subsection may establish and grant, in addition to [those] the other scholarships provided for in [Subsection C of] this section, athletic scholarships for tuition and fees. In no event shall the board of regents of any institution be allowed to award scholarships for tuition and fees for more than the number of athletic scholarships set .198163.1

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1 out in this subsection and in no event shall more than 2 seventy-five percent of the scholarships granted be for out-of-state residents: 3 the board of regents of the university of 4 (1)5 New Mexico may grant up to two hundred ninety-three athletic scholarships; 6 7 (2) the board of regents of New Mexico state university may grant up to two hundred seventy athletic 8 9 scholarships; the boards of regents of New Mexico 10 (3) highlands university, eastern New Mexico university and western 11 12 New Mexico university may each grant up to one hundred forty athletic scholarships; and 13 14 (4) the governing board of New Mexico junior college may grant up to fifty-two athletic scholarships. 15 In the event that the number of athletic Ε. 16 scholarships exceeds the number of athletic scholarships 17 permitted that institution by regulations and bylaws of the 18 19 national collegiate athletic association or the national 20 association of intercollegiate athletics of which that institution is a member, the appropriate board of regents shall 21 reduce the number of authorized tuition scholarships to comply 22 with association rules and regulations. 23 F. 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1	establish and grant, in addition to the other scholarships
2	provided for in this section, national merit scholarships for
3	tuition and fees in the same numbers as the athletic
4	scholarships established pursuant to Subsection D of this
5	section, provided that:
6	(1) each recipient of a national merit
7	<u>scholarship has been designated a national merit finalist by</u>
8	the national merit scholarship corporation;
9	(2) each recipient of a national merit
10	scholarship enroll in one of the state's educational
11	institutions set forth in this section or one of the branches
12	of those institutions within one year following completion of a
13	high school curriculum at a public or accredited private school
14	in the United States or of receiving a graduate equivalent
15	diploma; and
16	(3) in no event shall more than seventy-five
17	percent of the scholarships granted be for out-of-state
18	residents.
19	G. The national merit scholarships authorized in
20	this section may be renewed each semester for four consecutive
21	years, provided that the scholarship recipient is a full-time
22	student and has maintained a grade point average of 2.5 or
23	higher on a 4.0 scale for the semester prior to each renewal.
