Synopsis of SRC

The Senate Rules Committee amendment strikes "climate change" on page 1, line 17.

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Memorial 45 would requests OSE, Interstate Stream Commission, and water stakeholders in northeastern New Mexico study various options for addressing water shortage issues in that area, including identifying potential water sources outside of the region and developing a pipeline to some other large-scale regional water project to bring water to the area.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No fiscal implications.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to OSE, the SM 45 correctly notes the increasing stress on water supplies and recognizes the need for integrated, regional solutions to present and future water demand. The requested State Engineer and Interstate Stream Commission involvement is already being provided in the context of ongoing regional water planning. The ISC regional water plans,

currently being updated, can be used to further coordination of the stakeholders. The current ISC Planning regions covering this geographical northeastern area are: Colfax County, NE New Mexico, and the Mora-San Miguel Guadalupe regions. Solutions to the water management challenges facing this portion of the state will only be possible through regional efforts, such as those being conducted by the ISC. Additional funding for regional water planning may be required.
