### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to New Mexico First, the organization is partnering with New Mexico State University to convene a series of regional meetings to bring together agriculture stakeholders throughout the state. The meetings began December 2, 2015 in Roswell and will conclude on March 9, 2016 in Tucumcari. The meetings are designed to begin a process to develop a statewide agricultural resiliency plan.
