18	A. A health facility that performs a mammogram

24	college of radiology. If the health facility determines that a

"Your mammogram indicates that you have dense breast tissue. 3 Dense breast tissue is common and is not abnormal. However, 4 dense breast tissue may make it harder to evaluate the results 5 It may also be associated with an increased 6 of your mammogram. 7 risk of breast cancer. This information is being provided to 8 raise your awareness and to inform your conversation with your 9 health care provider. Together, you can decide if additional screening options may be right for you. A report of your 10 results was sent to your health care provider.". 11

B. A health facility may direct a patient who receives a diagnostic or screening mammogram to information about breast density. This informative material may include the American college of radiology's most current brochure on the subject of breast density available on the American college of radiology's website. Patients and health care providers can be further informed by materials from educational and advocacy organizations related to cancer or mammography.

C. Nothing in this section shall be deemed to create a duty of care or other legal obligation beyond the duty to provide notice as set forth in Subsection A of this section. Nothing in this section shall be deemed to require a notice that is inconsistent with the provisions of the federal Mammography Quality Standards Act of 1992 or any regulations .209834.1

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
