DECLARING JANUARY 31, 2018 "MILITARY AND VETERANS' DAY" IN THE SENATE.

WHEREAS, New Mexico has a long and proud history of military service by its residents, a service that dates back hundreds of years before statehood, when indigenous New Mexicans resisted the advancement of European settlers in the area; and

WHEREAS, this commitment to serving and protecting

residents have answered the call to arms to serve in World

War I, World War II, the Korean conflict, the Cold War, the

Vietnam conflict, the Gulf War, Bosnia, the global war on

WHEREAS, the Vietnam veterans memorial in Angel Fire was created in memory of Marine First Lieutenant David Westphall to honor all Vietnam-era veterans; and

WHEREAS, the Angel Fire memorial was the nation's first Vietnam conflict memorial and was the inspiration for the creation of the national Vietnam veterans memorial in Washington, D.C.; and

WHEREAS, this year marks the fiftieth anniversary of

2	WHEREAS, living in a free country, New Mexicans realize	
3	that this freedom does not come without a cost; and	
4	WHEREAS, freedom has been fought for by current service	
5	members and veterans;	
6	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE	
7	STATE OF NEW MEXICO that January 31, 2018 be declared	
8	"Military and Veterans' Day" in the senate and that gratitude	
9	be extended to New Mexico's current and former military	
10	service members for their service and sacrifices for their	
11	country; and
