- (1) able to demonstrate that it can effectively meet student health needs by hiring a part-time school nurse: or
- (2) not able to hire a qualified nurse or contract with a third party for a qualified nurse because of insufficient availability of qualified nurses in the school district's geographic vicinity; provided that the school district shall provide documentation of the school district's unsuccessful attempts to hire or contract with a school nurse to the department.
- C. The department shall promulgate rules pursuant to this section.
- D. As used in this section, "school nurse" means a person who:
- (1) is a nurse authorized pursuant to the Nursing Practice Act to practice as a professional registered nurse:
- (2) is licensed by the department and the board of nursing as a school nurse; and

"22-8-9. BUDGETS--MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS.--

- A. An operating budget for a school district shall not be approved by the department if the educational plan does not provide for:
- (1) a school year and school day as provided in Section 22-2-8.1 NMSA 1978; [and]
- (2) a pupil-teacher ratio or class or teaching load as provided in Section 22-10A-20 NMSA 1978; and
- (3) employment of a full-time school nurse as defined in Section 1 of this 2021 act at the school district unless a waiver has been granted as provided in Section 1 of this 2021 act.
- B. The department shall, by rule, establish the requirements for an instructional day, the standards for an instructional hour and the standards for a full-time teacher and for the equivalent thereof.
- C. As used in this section, "school nurse" means a person who:
- (1) is a nurse authorized pursuant to the Nursing Practice Act to practice as a professional registered nurse;
- (2) is licensed by the department and the board of nursing as a school nurse; and
- (3) provides services as a school nurse at a school."
