11	"2-15-9. INTERIM LEGISLATIVE ETHICS COMMITTEE	
12	PROCEDURESCONFIDENTIALITY	
13	A. Except as provided in this section, the	
14	New Mexico legislative council shall develop procedures to	
15	carry out the provisions of this section, in accordance with	
16	the existing procedures in the house and senate rules.	
17	B. A member of the interim legislative ethics	
18	committee is ineligible to participate in any matter relating	
19	directly to that member's conduct. In any such case, a	
20	substitute member to the committee shall be appointed from	
21	the same house from the same political party by the	
22	appropriate appointing authority. A member may seek to be	
23	disqualified from any matter brought before the interim	
24	legislative ethics committee on the grounds that the member	
25	cannot render a fair and impartial decision.	HB 169 Page 1

Disqualification must be approved by a majority vote of the remaining members of the committee. In any such case, a substitute member to the committee shall be appointed from the same political party as provided in this section.

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5 C. The interim legislative ethics committee is 6 authorized to issue advisory opinions on matters relating to ethical conduct during the interim. Any question relating to 7 8 the interpretation and enforcement of ethical principles as 9 applied to the legislature may be submitted in writing to the 10 New Mexico legislative council by a legislator describing a real or hypothetical situation and requesting an advisory 11 opinion establishing an appropriate standard of ethical 12 conduct for that situation. The question shall be referred 13 to the interim legislative ethics committee. 14

15 D. To initiate any action during the interim on alleged misconduct, any legislator or member of the public 16 may file a written, sworn complaint setting forth, with 17 specificity, the facts alleged to constitute unethical 18 conduct. A complaint shall be filed with the New Mexico 19 20 legislative council. Upon receipt of the complaint, the cochairs shall convene the interim legislative ethics 21 committee. 22

E. The interim legislative ethics committee shall
maintain rules of confidentiality unless the legislator
against whom a complaint is filed waives the rules or any

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1	part of them in writing. The confidentiality rules shall	
2	include the following provisions:	
3	(1) the committee and its staff shall not	
4	publicly disclose any information relating to the filing or	
5	investigation of a complaint, including the identity of the	
6	complainant or respondent, until after a finding of probable	
7	cause has been made that a violation has occurred;	
8	(2) the identity of the complainant shall be	
9	released to the respondent immediately upon request; and	
10	(3) no member of the committee or its staff	
11	may knowingly disclose any confidential information except as
