"sexual contact with an animal" means: 1 Ε. 2 the intentional insertion of the (1)3 genitals or mouth of an animal into an orifice of a human's 4 body; 5 (2) the intentional insertion of the 6 genitals or mouth of a human into an orifice of an animal's 7 body; 8 (3) the intentional insertion of an object 9 into the genitals or anus of an animal; and 10 (4) contact, handling or stimulation of the genitals or anus of an animal by a human. 11 "Sexual contact with an animal" does not include 12 accepted veterinary medical practices; accepted animal 13 husbandry, care and grooming practices in the caretaking of 14 15 animals; accepted practices related to the insemination of animals for the purpose of procreation; or accepted practices 16 related to conformation judging; and 17 "solicit" means to entice, induce, encourage or F. 18 attempt to persuade another person to commit an act of 19 20 bestiality." SECTION 3. A new section of the Criminal Code, 21 Section 30-9A-3 NMSA 1978, is enacted to read: 22 "30-9A-3. BESTIALITY--AGGRAVATED BESTIALITY--23 PENALTIES.--24 25 A. Bestiality consists of a person engaging in

1 sexual contact with an animal. A person who commits 2 bestiality is guilty of a fourth degree felony. 3 B. Promoting bestiality consists of a person: 4 coercing, soliciting or manipulating a (1)5 human to commit bestiality; or 6 selling or transferring, offering to (2) sell or transfer, advertising for sale or transfer, 7 8 purchasing or offering to purchase, possessing or otherwise 9 obtaining an animal with the intent that the animal be used 10 for bestiality. A person who commits promoting bestiality is guilty of a 11 fourth degree felony. 12 C. Aggravated bestiality consists of a person: 13 (1) committing bestiality or promoting 14 15 bestiality in the presence of a minor; or committing bestiality or promoting 16 (2) bestiality in which a minor is a participant. 17 A person who commits aggravated bestiality is guilty of 18 a third degree felony. 19 20 D. Emission by a human or animal is not required to prove sexual contact with an animal. 21 Ε. If a person has been convicted of a crime 22 pursuant to this section, in addition to any other penalties, 23 the sentencing court shall include in the judgment and 24 25 sentence all of the following:

SJC/SB 215 Page 3 (1) that all animals under the direct care and control of the convicted person be seized and turned over to an agent of the New Mexico livestock board or to an animal control agency operated by the state or a local government or an animal shelter or other animal welfare organization designated by the animal control agency. The receiver of seized animals has the authority to determine the disposition of seized animals, but shall not return the animals to the convicted person; and

10 (2)that the convicted person shall not be allowed to own, possess, reside with or exercise control over 11 any animal or engage in any occupation or profession, whether 12 paid or unpaid, at any place where animals are kept or cared 13 for, for a definite period not less than three years and not 14 15 more than fifteen years; provided that the time the person spent in actual confinement serving a criminal sentence shall 16 be excluded from the calculation of the definite period. 17

18 F. If a person has been convicted of a crime 19 pursuant to this section, in addition to criminal penalties 20 and other penalties specified in Subsection E of this 21 section, the sentencing court may order:

(1) that the convicted person submit to a psychological assessment and participate in appropriate counseling; and
