WHEREAS, Albuquerque ranks in the top ten most violent United States cities with a population over one hundred thousand; and

WHEREAS, in 2014, the homicide rate for Albuquerque was at its lowest, with only thirty homicides occurring that year; and

WHEREAS, in 2021, the homicide rate for Albuquerque increased by forty-six percent with one hundred fourteen homicides; and

WHEREAS, in 2022, there were one hundred twenty-one homicides in Albuquerque, the highest on record since the .224152.1
