SUMMARY

Synopsis of Senate Bill 179

Senate Bill 179 (SB179) appropriates \$350 thousand from the general fund to the University of New Mexico (UNM) health sciences office for diversity, equity and inclusion for Spanish-language health sciences curriculum development and implementation.

This bill does not contain an effective date and, as a result, would go into effect 90 days after the Legislature adjourns, which is May 20, 2026.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$350 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY28 shall revert to the general fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

UNM reports:

The UNM HSC, a Hispanic-Serving Institution and the largest publicly funded institution

awarding health professions degrees in New Mexico, is uniquely positioned to develop New Mexico's next generation of bilingual English /Spanish healthcare workers.

The UNM School of Medicine has offered the Clinical Communication Skills in Spanish (CCSiS) program since 2022 as an opt-in program during the fourth year of medical education. CCSiS directly increases the number of certified health professionals who can provide direct, efficient, empathetic, and linguistically competent care for Spanish-speaking patients across New Mexico.
