### SUMMARY

#### Synopsis of Senate Bill 218

Senate Bill 218 (SB218) appropriates \$5 million from the general fund to the Department of Finance and Administration for the purpose of constructing, equipping, and furnishing a regional emergency operations center in Los Alamos county.

This bill does not contain an effective date and, as a result, would go into effect 90 days after the Legislature adjourns, which is May 20, 2026.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$5 million contained in this bill is a nonrecurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY27 shall revert to the general fund.

### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SB218 aims to create a facility where emergency operations can be managed. Additionally, the building would serve as a training facility for fire fighters and police officers.
