SUMMARY

Synopsis of House Memorial 51

House Memorial 51 (HM51) requests the Department of Health's Nicotine Use Prevention and Control (NUPAC) program members be requested to make recommendations to the Legislature to prioritize and increase the funding for evidence-based tobacco prevention programs to reduce tobacco-related illness and save lives in New Mexico; Further the memorial requests the Department of Health and the Taxation and Revenue Department convene a task force to study the effect of excise taxes on the sale of tobacco products.


FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to the U.S. Center for Disease Control (CDC), tobacco use accounts for one of every five deaths in the United States, approximately 480 thousand people each year. Further, for each person who dies from tobacco use, another 33 will suffer a tobacco-related illness; tobacco use has been linked to diseases in nearly every organ. The national economic cost in medical expenses and lost productivity is over \$289 billion annually.



According to the Department of Health:
