SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill:

House Bill 383 (HB 383) expands the Pawnbrokers Act so the daily report currently required for used property which is received or purchased each day to include new property as well. The report must also include a photograph of any item of gold, silver, platinum or other precious metals or gems.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

With the weak economy in New Mexico and other states, many more customers are turning to pawnshops for help in paying bills or buying groceries or prescriptions. Because the price of gold is high, people are looking for new outlets to sell jewelry, heirlooms, and other items made of precious metals. HB 383 would provide another tool for law enforcement to assist victims of theft by now requiring Pawnbrokers daily report to include new property and a photograph of any item of gold, silver, platinum or other precious metals or gems.
