### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The American heart associations go red for women movement has had a positive impact on the health of women for ten years helping to save more than 627,000 lives. Heart disease is the number-one killer of women and cardiovascular diseases cause one in three women's deaths each year. The memorial notes that all people are urged to show their support for women and the fight against heart disease by wearing the color red.
