### Synopsis of SB 8

Senate Bill 8, Chapter 5, signed with line-item vetoes, provides for use of severance tax bonding capacity to assist in addressing solvency issues. The vetoes total nearly \$1.7 million allowing four projects to remain active. The vetoes will reduce 2017 severance tax bond capacity. The projects include the following:

- 1. four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) to plan, design and construct phase 2 drainage improvements for flood control on Alberta road for the southern Sandoval county arroyo flood control authority in Rio Rancho in Sandoval county;
- 2. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to purchase and install street lights along Trumbull avenue southeast and San Pedro drive southeast in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;
- 3. five hundred eighty-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$587,500) reauthorized to plan, design, renovate, construct, equip and furnish the permanent museum at the Indian pueblo cultural center; and
- 4. five hundred sixty-four thousand dollars (\$564,000) to plan, design, construct, equip and furnish an information and welcome center at the entrance of the national Hispanic cultural center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

The bill deauthorizes 115 inactive projects (see attached chart), and contains an emergency clause.

#### **SUMMARY**

Senate Bill 8 provides for non-recurring use of severance tax bonding capacity to assist in addressing solvency issues. The bill contains an emergency clause.

Section 1 will revert the unexpended general fund appropriations for various capital assets appropriated in 2015 and 2016.

Sections 2 and 4 deauthorize the unexpended and unencumbered balances of certain severance tax bond projects appropriated in 2013 and 2014.

Subsection C of Section 4 reauthorizes the taxable bond proceeds deauthorized to restore general fund capital expenditures made on or before June 30, 2016.

Section 3 authorizes the use of severance tax bonds to fund the same projects for which general fund appropriations were reverted in Section 1. The State Board of Finance will be able to assign a portion of the tax-exempt bond proceeds deauthorized in Subsections A and B of Section 2 to these projects, or will be able to issue new taxable severance tax bonds for any of these projects that do not qualify for tax-exempt financing as outlined in Section 8.

Section 5 reauthorizes the unexpended balance of certain supplemental severance tax bond appropriations issued on a taxable basis to instead be appropriated to the general fund to restore general fund capital expenditures made on or before June 30, 2016.

Section 6 deauthorizes certain supplemental severance tax bond appropriations issued on a taxable basis to instead be appropriated to the general fund to restore general fund capital expenditures made on or before June 30, 2016.

Section 7 authorizes the issuance of short-term severance tax bonds ("sponge bonds") in Fiscal Year 2017 over and above the amount that is typically allowed in statute to intercept the amount that would otherwise transfer to the Severance Tax Permanent Fund in Fiscal Year 2017. This practice has sometimes been referred to as a "super sweep." The proceeds of the sponge bonds, would be appropriated to the general fund to restore general fund capital expenditures made on or before June 30, 2016.

Sections 9 and 10 amend existing law to permanently reduce the percentage of senior severance tax bonding capacity that is earmarked to the water trust board, the tribal infrastructure board, and the colonias infrastructure board by 1 percent to each of the three boards starting in Fiscal Year 2017. The water earmark of capacity is reduced from 10 percent to 9 percent of capacity, and the tribal and colonias earmarks are reduced from 5.5 percent to 4.5 percent of capacity.

Section 11 would further adjust water, tribal and colonias earmarks in Fiscal Year 2017. Severance Tax Bond (STB) capacity, for purposes of calculating the three earmarks would be reduced by the amount of FY17 capacity already issued as a result of this bill during the 2016 special session.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This bill would increase general fund reserves by a non-recurring \$89.8 million in Fiscal Year 2017, equivalent to approximately 1.5 percent of recurring general fund appropriations.

Section 1 reverts \$56.2 million in general fund appropriations for capital expenditures, and Section 3 provides continued funding for those projects from severance tax bonds.

Sections 4, 5, 6 and 7 provide for a combined \$33.7 million of taxable bond proceeds to be used to restore general fund capital expenditures that were made in Fiscal Years 2016 and prior.

Sections 9 and 10 reduce water, tribal and colonias earmarks from a combined 21 percent to 18 percent of senior STB capacity. This will reduce capacity for those earmarks by a recurring \$4.7 million starting in Fiscal Year 2017. Each of the three earmarks would see an equal reduction of \$1.58 million in Fiscal Year 2017. Severance tax bond capacity available for legislative capital appropriations would increase by the same amount each year.

Section 11 changes the way Fiscal Year 2017 capacity for water, tribal and colonias earmarks are calculated. Typically, the earmarks receive a percentage of total fiscal year STB capacity. In Fiscal Year 2017, total STB capacity would be reduced by the amount of capacity that is authorized during the 2016 special legislative session for purposes of estimating the earmarks. This will reduce combined funding for the earmarks by an estimated \$2.7 million in Fiscal Year 2017, and increase legislative capacity to authorize by the same amount.

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

The criteria used for identifying deauthorization of projects appropriated in 2013 and 2014

include projects with no intergovernmental grant agreement, notice of obligation, or expenditure. A notice of obligation is required to encumber any of the state funds for third party obligations. In addition, entities have not encumbered at least 5 percent of the bond proceeds within six months of bond issuance, which they certified to do as a prerequisite of issuance of the bonds.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS**

With the voiding of 115 inactive capital projects, state agencies will experience moderate administrative efficiencies which will assist them as they deal with higher than normal vacancies in Fiscal Years 2017 and 2018.
