## A MEMORIAL

DECLARING MARCH 2, 2017 "ASIAN AMERICAN DAY" IN THE SENATE.

WHEREAS, there are more than thirty thousand Asians living in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, Asians are among the fastest-growing minority groups in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, Asians in New Mexico come from Afghanistan,
Bangladesh, Bhutan, China, India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq,
Japan, Korea, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Pakistan, the
Philippines, Taiwan, Thailand, Tibet and Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, Asians have worked on the railroads and in agriculture in New Mexico since the nineteenth century and fought bravely in World War I, World War II, the Korean and Vietnam conflicts, the Gulf War and in Afghanistan and Iraq, and they have received Congressional Medals of Honor, Purple Hearts and other military commendations; and

WHEREAS, this year represents the fifty-second anniversary of the passage of the federal Immigration and Nationality Act of 1965, signed into law by President Lyndon B. Johnson at the foot of the statue of liberty on October 3, 1965; and

WHEREAS, prior to passage of the Immigration and
Nationality Act of 1965, Asians were greatly affected by the
Chinese Exclusion Act, passed in 1882, which restricted
