SUMMARY

Synopsis of SJC Amendment

The Senate Judiciary Committee amendment to HCPAC amendment to House Bill 31 strikes “the District of Columbia” from the list of laws or ordinances under which a person may have one DWI.

Synopsis of HCPAC Amendment

The House Consumer and Public Affairs Committee amendment to House Bill 31 strikes “of the person’s most recent offense” added by the original bill, adds clarifying language on page five about the DWI conviction and makes grammatical corrections.

Synopsis of the Original Bill

HB31 proposes to amend the ignition interlock licensing requirement to provide that a person with only one prior conviction for DWI in another jurisdiction may obtain a New Mexico driver’s license upon proof of completion of all sentencing conditions.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) and the Administrative Hearings Office (AHO) report no fiscal impact from this bill.

The Taxation and Revenue Department (TRD) reports it will take approximately three weeks to make changes to its computer system at a cost of \$8,400.00. It also states that the revenue impact is based on 214 first time out-of-state interlock transactions in FY16.
