### Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 139 would require that insured New Mexicans be issued an insurance ID card in a timely fashion, containing the following information:

- Card issuer identification
- Name of cardholder
- Cardholder's identification number
- Group health plan number.

Separate sections of the bill apply to various categories of health insurance, as indicated in the table below, but are otherwise identical.
