DECLARING JANUARY 30, 2018 AS "WEAR RED DAY" IN THE SENATE AND URGING ALL CITIZENS TO SHOW THEIR SUPPORT FOR WOMEN AND THE FIGHT AGAINST HEART DISEASE BY WEARING THE COLOR RED.

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WHEREAS, according to American heart association statistics, cardiovascular disease is the number-one killer of women in the United States; and

WHEREAS, some risk factors, such as blood pressure, smoking, cholesterol and lack of regular physical activity, can be controlled; and

14 WHEREAS, the American heart association's go red for
15 women movement motivates women to learn their family
16 histories and to meet with a health care provider to
17 determine their risks for cardiovascular disease and stroke;

WHEREAS, go red for women encourages women to take control of their heart health by knowing and managing these five numbers that can be life-changing: total cholesterol, high-density lipoprotein (hdl) good cholesterol, blood pressure, blood sugar and body mass index;
