## **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 227 is related to special districts; expands the term and increases the amount of a potential levy assessed by a soil and water conservation district (SWCD). This bill amends Section 73-20-46 to increase the amount a SWCD may levy from one dollar (\$1.00) to five dollars (\$5.00) per thousand dollars (\$1,000) of net taxable value. Further, this bill eliminates the sunset clause that limits the levy to ten years and strikes additional language related to the sunset clause. The effective date of this bill is July 1, 2018.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This bill has no fiscal impact to the general fund.

### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

The New Mexico Department of Agriculture (NMDA) states this bill brings the soil and water conservation district levy in line with other levies assessed by similar districts, such as Watershed Districts (Section 73-20-17 NMSA 1978) and Conservancy Districts (Section 73-16-2 NMSA 1978).
