A level two license is a nine-year license 11 granted to a teacher who meets the qualifications for that 12 level and who annually demonstrates essential competency to 13 teach. If a level two teacher does not demonstrate essential 14 15 competency in a given school year, the school district shall provide the teacher with additional professional development 16 and peer intervention during the following school year. If 17 by the end of that school year the teacher fails to 18 demonstrate essential competency, a school district may 19 20 choose not to contract with the teacher to teach in the classroom. 21 Β. The department shall issue a level two license 22 to an applicant who has successfully taught at least three, 23

but no more than five, years as a level one teacher or an

alternative level one teacher, or a combination of the two,

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or is granted reciprocity as provided by department rules. 1 An applicant for a level two license shall: 2 3 (1) demonstrate essential competency required by the department as verified by the local 4 superintendent through the highly objective uniform statewide 5 standard of evaluation; and 6 (2) meet other qualifications as required by 7 8 the department. C. The department shall provide for qualifications 9 for specific grade levels, types and subject areas of level 10 two licensure, including early childhood, elementary, middle, 11 secondary, special and vocational education. 12 D.
