SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 440 (SB440) appropriates \$100 thousand from the general fund to Indian affairs department for the purpose of funding the eastern Navajo fair and rodeo.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$100 thousand contained in this bill is a nonrecurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2020 shall revert to the general fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

IAD reports The Eastern Navajo Fair and Rodeo occurs annually, usually in late July, in Crownpoint, northeast of Gallup. It brings together the local, rodeo and livestock communities and is a tourist draw. The event encourages a practical interest among young people of 4-H and FFA to showcase their projects and skills among the community.
