Synopsis of Memorial

Senate Memorial 109 requests the Army Corps of Engineers to study the potential for flooding and help Colfax County identify potential flood mitigation and possible funding in response to the Ute Park fire.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There is no fiscal impact to state agencies as a result of this memorial. The state Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHSEM) is responding to the Ute Fire burn scar and is working in coordination with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). Additionally, DHSEM is working with the State Engineer to install rain gauge sensors at the burn scar.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

DHSEM explains “the Ute Park Fire Damage Assessment and Burned Area Emergency Rehabilitation Plan was completed August 2018 through funding provided by New Mexico Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management. The Ute Park Fire Hydrologic Study was completed January 2019 by the United States Army Corp of Engineers.”
