A MEMORIAL

DECLARING FEBRUARY 19, 2020 "MISSING AND UNIDENTIFIED PERSONS DAY" IN THE SENATE.

WHEREAS, to assist in the effort to locate and identify missing and unidentified persons, within thirty days the department of public safety is now required by the Mark Daniel Aguilar information sharing requirement of the Missing Persons Information and Reporting Act to share the following information with the national missing and unidentified persons system created by the United States department of justice's national institute of justice:

- A. all information in the missing persons information clearinghouse; and
- B. all information the department receives pursuant to the Missing Persons Information and Reporting Act regarding the identification and location of missing and unidentified persons or human remains; and

WHEREAS, the Mark Daniel Aguilar information sharing requirement became effective on June 14, 2019; and

WHEREAS, in addition, public notice required pursuant to the Missing Persons and Information Reporting Act was expanded by 2019 Senate Bill 42 to include a "silver alert" when a person suffering from dementia or Alzheimer's disease goes missing, regardless of the age of the missing person;

and

WHEREAS, the bill also clarifies the responsibilities of the various agencies and cellular service companies involved in the notice process; and

WHEREAS, there are currently over seven hundred fifty-six active missing persons cases and one hundred eighteen unidentified persons cases in New Mexico that have been successfully shared and imported into the national missing and unidentified persons system as of December 31, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the national missing and unidentified persons system has seventeen thousand one hundred twenty-four missing persons and thirteen thousand one hundred thirty-six unidentified persons entered into the national database; and

WHEREAS, the national crime information center as of December 2018 contained eighty-five thousand four hundred fifty-nine active missing persons records; and

WHEREAS, the national missing and unidentified persons system is a nationwide information clearinghouse for missing, unidentified and unclaimed persons cases across the United States that provides resources to law enforcement, medical examiners, coroners, allied forensic professionals and family members of missing persons; and

WHEREAS, missing persons cases affect people of every age, race, religion, socioeconomic status, gender and social

1	and cultural background, changing the dynamic of a family in	
2	an instant; and	
3	WHEREAS, few circumstances are more devastating to a	
4	family than the unknown whereabouts or fate of a loved one;	
5	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE	
6	STATE OF NEW MEXICO that February 19, 2020 be declared	
7	"Missing and Unidentified Persons Day" in the senate; and	
8	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that recognition be extended to	
9	all missing and unidentified persons and to the many families	
10	of missing persons that endure ambiguous loss; and	
11	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that New Mexicans recognize those	
12	families affected by a loved one's disappearance and continue	
13	to keep missing persons a priority; and	
14	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be
