About House Bill 280

Tribal Education Technical Assistance Centers

- At the 2022 Semi-Annual Government-to-Government Indian Education Summit, Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham and the three education agencies announced that they will pursue legislation in 2023 to establish two Tribal Education Technical Assistance Centers in New Mexico.
- The Tribal Education Technical Assistance Centers will focus on supporting Tribal entities, such as Tribal Education Departments (TEDs) and leaders in addition to providing assistance to Local Education Agencies (LEAs) and Tribal colleges.
- Activities will include many of the things that Tribal leaders have expressed as vital, such as:
 - 1. Promoting Indigenous values, languages, and cultures
 - 2. Capacity building for programs and capital projects
 - 3. Developing education policy
 - Developing culturally relevant curricula and materials
