






- Unser Gateway Commercial Area

# 2025 Legislative Session

The Rio Rancho Governing Body will officially adopt the 2025 Legislative Priorities and Capital Outlay requests later this year. Priorities preview includes:

#### Investment in public infrastructure

• Rio Rancho, like many communities, has seen 50-150% cost increases in infrastructure projects in recent years

### Investment in public safety

• In addition to personnel needs, Rio Rancho is seeking funding to build a new Fire Station to serve the growing population

### Investment in workforce development and economic opportunities

• Rio Rancho supports legislation that makes available more resources for job creation and economic development programs, including site readiness

#### IPRA Reform to modernize and offset the associated cost burden

In less than four years, a doubling in records request (with increased complexity)
