- Acting as a liaison between creative industries-related businesses and organizations.




## CREATIVE INDUSTRIES DIVISION



### 2023 – 2024 \$2M Special Appropriation, HB 8

- 18 grants totaling \$1.8M to communities
- Provided capacity for 82
   partnerships with other agencies,
   educational institutions, industry
   associations, and community
   organizations
- Assisted 1,158 entrepreneurs and small businesses
- Supported 34 programs across 18 awards






## CREATIVE INDUSTRIES DIVISION



## HISTORIC PRODUCTION SPEND




#### **Production Spend (in millions)**

## ~8,000 jobs -- and growing


- Union, guild members, non-union

### NM RESIDENT CREW MEDIAN WAGE



## 39% median wage increase since 2019

- \$36.75 = NM film crew median wage
- \$20.97 = NM median wage in all other industries
  NM minimum wage = \$12



## HISTORIC TAX CREDIT PAYOUTS





### ECONOMIC IMPACT





- Economic Return on Investment (ROI) is an important measure of the effectiveness of the tax credit
- This measure of how much economic value is created per \$1 of investment in tax credits by the state
- Overall, the tax credit program has a positive and significant economic ROI

## New Mexico Media Arts Collective



- \$40M was allocated to establish the New Mexico Media Arts Collective (NMMAC) during the 2022 legislative session
- Main campus in Albuquerque; satellite campus in Las Cruces
- Will offer industry-standard, on-set, and craft-specific workforce training for the film, television, and digital media industries



## NMMAC MAIN CAMPUS













- Located in the Albuquerque Rail Yards
- Collaboration with CNM
- Construction is well underway
- Building to commence in October
- On track for January 2026 opening
