NMSU Program Updates (9:19 a.m.)

Rick Marlatt, dean, College of Health, Education and Social Transformation, NMSU, provided an overview of the college's programs, student demographics, research centers and student experiential learning. Alexa Doig, Ph.D., R.N., director, School of Nursing, NMSU, presented about the School of Nursing's Doctor of Nursing Practice - Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner program. Food Security (11:06 a.m.)

Elizabeth Groginsky, secretary, Early Childhood Education and Care Department (ECECD), discussed student demographics and funding and goals for expanding access to and improving state-funded pre-kindergarten programs. Dr. Tolman and Josh Chaffin, program evaluator, LFC, reviewed findings and recommendations from the LFC's August 2025 evaluation of the Healthy Universal School Meals program. Gregory Frostad, assistant secretary of education, PED, and Laura Henry-Hand, deputy director, Student Success and Wellness Bureau, PED, highlighted the success of the Healthy Universal School Meals program and the PED's plans for the program's future. Philip Huston, executive director, Carlsbad LifeHouse, Inc., gave an update on services provided by Carlsbad LifeHouse, Inc. and discussed the climate of behavioral health and substance abuse services in rural southern New Mexico. He discussed challenges faced by providers of those services and offered legislative recommendations that could reduce barriers to accessing mental health care in rural settings. Welcome to NMSU (9:11 a.m.)

Valerio Ferme, president, NMSU, welcomed the committee to NMSU, highlighted mental health services available to students and described initiatives to prevent sexual assault. He discussed campus safety and resources for students who struggle with substance abuse and food insecurity.

Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine (BCOM) Update (9:50 a.m.)

John L. Hummer, co-founder, president and chief executive officer, BCOM, spoke about the BCOM's funding sources, student demographics, student debt, residencies matched into by BCOM graduates and common careers of BCOM graduates. He addressed challenges faced by

the school, including the state's medical malpractice climate and difficulty retaining graduates in New Mexico.

Opioid Settlement Funds: Dona Ana County (10:30 a.m.)

Jamie Michael, director, Health and Human Services, Dona Ana County, described the expenditure of opioid settlement funds for behavioral health and substance abuse services in Dona Ana County and stated that the county often collaborates with the City of Las Cruces to provide such services. The county hopes to implement universal screening to identify opioid use disorder in its early stages among residents, increase access to naloxone and improve access to medication for opioid use disorders in rural and Spanish-speaking communities. Tom Schripsema, D.D.S., executive director, New Mexico Dental Association, described the landscape of dentistry in New Mexico, including dental workforce trends and the difficulties of recruiting dentists to New Mexico, especially in rural areas. He presented findings and recommendations of the New Mexico Dental Association Foundation's 2025 report on special needs dentistry in the state, provided an update on Touro College of Dental Medicine's clinic in Albuquerque and discussed barriers to dental care in rural areas and among people with special needs. Hospital Finance 101 (2:19 p.m.)

He provided a time line of changes to Medicaid resulting from the 2025 federal budget reconciliation bill and explained how those changes could impact hospitals.
