

How do Dual Credit Students Compare to Non Dual Credit Students?*


CNM GPA comparison



Students who complete the Bridge Scholarship requirements to obtain the Lottery Scholarship




Percentage of students who retain Lottery Scholarship into their second year




This implies Dual Credit students are better prepared for college.


Dual Credit Students are 2x more likely to graduate on time than non dual credit students**

Dual Credit

CNM has **Dual Credit Agreements with more than 80 schools/school districts across the state**, in 15 different counties. Serving students in urban, rural and Native American communities.

CNM has served **over 26,000 dual credit students** since the 2007-2008 academic year.

CNM Increased the number of Dual Credit hours by 43.5% since 2013.

CNM makes **college classes accessible** to anyone through a number of online offerings and convenient locations around Albuquerque and Rio Rancho.

CNM has **transfer agreements with all New Mexico universities** reducing the time and cost of obtaining a bachelor's degree.

In AY 2015-2016 the graduation rate of APS students who took dual credit classes was 16.9% higher than those without.*

National studies indicate that participation in **Dual Credit coursework correlates positively with college enrollment**, **persistence in college**, **and higher college grade point averages**.*

College & Career High School (CCHS) - an Early College High School

Consistently earned an 'A' school grade from NM PED every year since opening.

Has a 100% high school graduation rate.

Opened to the first class in 2013-2014 Academic year, students can declare any CNM major of study. Student profile:

- 68% free/reduced lunch
- 27% first generation college students
- 11% English is not their first language

49% of the class of 2017 earned a certificate or associate degree by high school graduation.

Class of 2018 is on track for **60% of the 55 seniors** to graduate with a certificate or associate degree.

Hispanic students make up more than half of the students served at CCHS each semester and **54% of all students served**.
