CNM's new Career & Technical Education Alternative Teacher Licensure Program certificate only takes one year to complete, and all five courses are available online, so you can be paid to work as a vocational teacher while completing your requirements.

If you have regular access to computer/reliable internet and one of the following combinations of education/ experience in a CTE field*, you're eligible!

- Bachelor's degree which includes 32 credit hours of vocational-technical training related to the occupational area
- Associate's degree plus two (2) years work experience related to the occupational area
- Certificate plus three (3) years work experience related to the occupational area
- High school diploma/(GED) plus five (5) years work experience related to the occupational area

The program is aligned to the guidelines for the New Mexico Secondary Technical-Vocational Education teaching license for grades 7-12. Individuals who complete the certificate program are eligible to apply for licensure with the New Mexico Public Education Department.



Career and Technical Education (CTE) Teacher Licensure Certificate at CNM

The Career and Technical Education (CTE) Teacher Licensure Certificate at CNM is an online, 16 credit, year-long program designed to support new and early career CTE teachers to develop the practice-based skills and knowledge needed to be effective educators. The program is specifically designed to utilize the NMTEACH evaluation framework and provide participants with hands-on experience in the classroom.

PARTICIPANTS: This program is ideal for newly hired CTE teachers, individuals with an accomplished industry background interested in a career in teaching, and post-secondary students of CTE programs who want to become teachers in their field. CTE fields include business, health sciences (nursing, EMS, sports medicine), IT/computer science, agricultural science, construction/engineering, culinary arts, industrial arts (carpentry, metals, auto), family and consumer science, hospitality and tourism, and more!

LICENSURE: Courses are aligned to the New Mexico Public Education Department's (NMPED) guidelines for the Secondary Technical-Vocational Education license, and individuals who complete the course of studies are eligible to be issued a regular level 1 license: https://webnew.ped.state.nm.us/bureaus/licensure/how-to-apply/secondary-vocational-technical/

FIELD EXPERIENCE: Participants are eligible to obtain the provisional Level 1P Secondary Technical-Vocational Education license upon meeting the education and experience requirements (see below) and they will have the option of pursuing employment as a CTE teacher while completing their coursework. This work experience is recommended and will count toward the field experience requirements. Those who are not employed as a CTE teacher will participate in a year-long practicum field experience to ensure hands-on opportunities to experience the work of CTE teaching.

TIMELINE: Courses will begin in early August of 2018 and continue through the fall of 2018 and spring of 2019. Applications will be accepted through July of 2018.

- -EDUC 2244: Methods and Classroom Design for Career and Technical Education

REQUIREMENTS: In order to be eligible to participate in this certificate program, applicants must 1) meet one of the education/experience criteria below, 2) have a job teaching CTE at the secondary level or be available to complete a year-long field experience in a CTE setting at the secondary level, and 3) have access to a computer and reliable internet. Minimum education/experience combinations:

- BA/BS including 32 credit hours of vocational-technical training related to the occupational area; **or**
- AA/AS plus two (2) years verified work experience related to the occupational area; or
- Certificate plus three (3) years verified work experience related to the occupational area; or
- High school diploma/GED plus five (5) years verified work experience related to the occupational area.
