SUMMARY OF PLANNING PROJECT

This W.K. Kellogg Foundation planning grant has provided the Native Faculty of the College of Education (COE) the means to develop an infrastructure that will be inclusive of faculty expertise combined with tribal perspectives for addressing high quality education from early childhood to higher education through the reimagination of the Institute of American Indian Education

KEY OUT COMES OF PLANNING PROJECT

- 1. Establish guiding principles with strong community input
- 2. Plan for and identify the mission and responsibilities of advisory councils for IAIE
- 3. Identify specific actions for each of the three domains
- 4. Finalize the infrastructure plan of COE IAIE
- 5. Hold a summit to finalize the guiding principles and infrastructure
- 6. Present a plan for systemic reform to the COE UNM leadership, NM Public Education Department, and the NM State Legislature to support high quality preparation of educators in early childhood through higher education for Indigenous Peoples of NM

PLANNING DOMAINS

<u>Domain 1:</u> Explores effective practices that shape curriculum, instruction, assessment, and policy in the pre-K-12 context; led by Vincent Werito

<u>Domain 2:</u> Explores and identifies effective measures for student funding, recruitment, retention, graduation, and certification foci of the pre-K-20 pathway; led by Lorenda Belone

<u>Domain 3:</u> Explores and identifies measures for increasing AIs in educational leadership and higher education; led by Robin Minthorn

SHORT & LONG-TERM GOALS

- ❖ Provide community forum summaries at on-site community sessions
- ❖ Develop guiding principles based on feedback from summit & forums
- Seek external funding to support projects to serve Native Nations in New Mexico
- ❖ Implement recommendations from summit and forums
- ❖ Disseminate findings to major stakeholders and policy makers

Domain 2: Pre-K to 20 Pathway Efforts

- When you hear "educational success," what does this mean to you? Or, what does this mean when you think of your community or your children?
- What are the challenges students in your community face getting into college and in completing college?

Domain 3: Education Professional Preparation & Higher Education

- What has your experience and interaction with leadership in schools been and what changes are needed to be responsive to your children and community?
- What does being a healthy child and community member look like to you?
