**Total Project Cost Estimates - \$5,900,000**

The USS Albuquerque (SSN-706), a nuclear-powered Los Angeles-class attack submarine, was decommissioned in 2017 after being in service for nearly 34 years. The submarine was assigned the hull number "SSN-706" in homage to the 1706 founding of the City of Albuquerque.

The City of Albuquerque has received the submarine's iconic sail and fairwater planes from the U.S. Navy. Measuring 33' wide by 26' long and standing 19' high, the sail will be installed in the water as the centerpiece of a dramatic monument that will honor the servicemen and women who helped protect our nation's freedom. The monument's location at Tingley Beach will enhance this popular site with a new public gathering space and point of civic pride.
