Background: 2011 – 2013 Drought

Consequences of Strict Priority Enforcement

- Could shut-off 1960 or earlier priority rights
- Shut off junior groundwater use in EBID
- Shut off 100% other junior users (e.g. domestic wells, municipal & commercial, irrigation)
- Continued litigation over priority dates between Las Cruces, NMSU, EBID irrigators

Groundwater Users' Response

- 2013: Farmer Groups Approach OSE to Collaborate on Groundwater Mgt. Issues
- 2014: Major GW Stakeholders Sign MOU
 - **o** Options to strict priority enforcement
 - Work on long-term supply & management issues

2016 Settlement Framework

•Support the 2008 Operating Agt. with operational adjustments, if found to be necessary

•Work together on groundwater management

•Senior water right owners will not seek priority enforcement against one another

2017 Accomplishments

- EBID Joins in LRGWU Negotiations
- Formation of Tech Committee
- Confidentiality Order and Stay in LRG Adjudication
- Close collaboration with the State (AG & OSE)
- Written Agreement in Progress



- Complete NM Portion of Settlement (Groundwater Users, State, EBID)
- Work with US and Texas parties to finalize settlement
- GW Mgt. may require new governmental structure approved by legislature
- Implementation of settlement likely to require state financial support
