



>>> FUTURE – FMS CTE High School

FMS is starting the process of a planning year to **work with our local community and industry** to re-imagine our CATE center to develop new programs and pathways to meet our local workforce and economic development needs. The goal is **to develop the CATE center** into its own **wall-2-wall CTE high school** or even potentially in the future, a **Regional Area Technical Center (ATC)** as other states in the four corners have done. We plan to integrate a new programs at the CATE Center with a soft launch of new programming for the Fall of 2024.

Additionally, through work with regional district partners as part of the **"Four Corners College and Career Pathways Partnership"** we will be working to develop **CTE regional industry convenings, shared industry advisories,** collaborative **curricula development** for common CTE programs of study, **CTE Dual Credit expansion** and most importantly create a space to share innovations and promote collaboration within the four corners region.
