New Mexico Community Action Agencies (NMCAAs) are requesting \$2 million from the State to continue our work to strengthen our communities.

The Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) provides critical funding to CAAs for programs & activities that alleviate the causes & conditions of poverty in communities.

There are **6 NM designated Community Action Agencies (CAAs)**. These nonprofits provide **programming to all 33 NM counties**, several pueblos, and 100000+ New Mexicans each year.
