# HISTORY OF RECLAMATION FUND

- In the 1970s, the Reclamation Fund was established as a non-reverting fund and is funded by the Conservation Tax to ensure proper plugging and reclamation efforts on retired oil and gas wells and associated facilities.
- Could be thought of as an insurance pool that all producers already pay into.
- Over time, the balance of the Reclamation Fund has been swept when the state encountered hard economic times, and in one extreme example, the funding formula was amended so that currently only 2/19ths of the Conservation Tax proceeds are sent to the Reclamation Fund.

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- The O&G Conservation Tax rate is 0.0019, except when WTI is over \$70 for a quarter, in which case the rate is 0.0024. 10.5% of the proceeds are distributed to the Reclamation Fund, and the other 89.5% goes to the General Fund.
- When the O&G Conservation Tax rate is 0.0024, 19.7% of the proceeds are distributed to the Reclamation Fund and the remainder to the General Fund.

# Orphan Well Plugging

#### **68,516 ACTIVE NEW MEXICO WELLS**

- 34,000 State & Fee wells
- 349 State & Fee orphaned wells
- Abandonment rate: 1%
- 2022, 451 state-plugged wells, 49 OCD-plugged wells.
- OCD Estimate: 1,700 total abandoned wells in the state, including Federal.



### **Reclamation Fund Balance**

- 2022 Reclamation Fund Balance: \$21,336,29
- As of February 2024, the balance in the Reclamation Fund is \$54MM. Thanks to increased federal funding and continued healthy Conservation Tax funding.

## MODERNIZING THE FUND

The goal is to achieve and maintain a sustainable balance in the Oil and Gas Reclamation Fund to put to best use industry dollars to increase the plugging efforts and ensure the highest level of reclamation.

# MODERNIZING THE FUND

- Bipartisan legislation ensuring \$150MM stays in the Reclamation Fund, and anything over that will revert to the General Fund each year. This amount will plug and remediate approximately 1000 state wells.
- OCD should contract with additional outside providers to complete the plugging and remediation work. The OCD would still develop the abandoned well list, use their police powers to obtain plugging orders, inspect the quality of the work, then pay once the work is complete.
