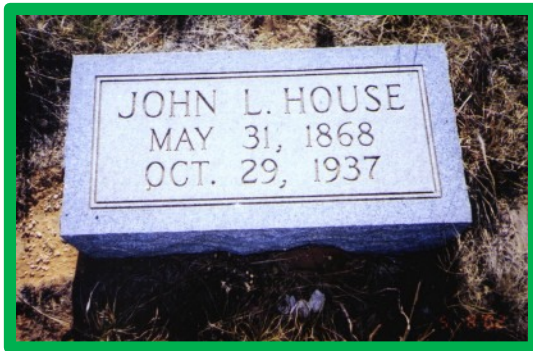

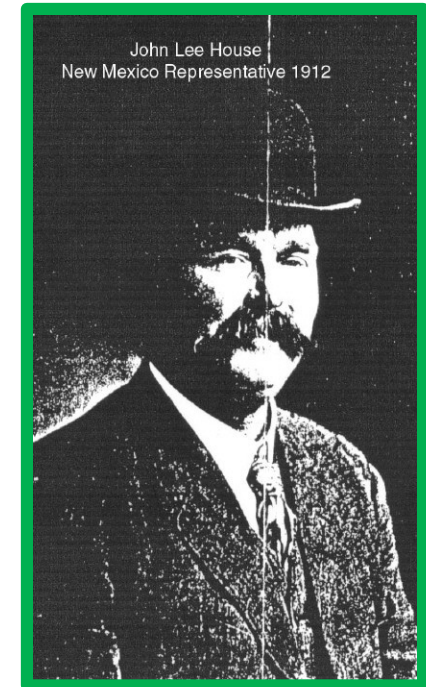

Interesting Facts about House Municipal Schools: ***“Where Everyone is Someone Special”***

- **147th smallest high school in NM of 160 schools ranked by NMAA**
- **First school in House, NM was built in 1921**

 - ❖ Class 2A Boys Basketball – *First time in NMAA History a Co-op team won championship title*



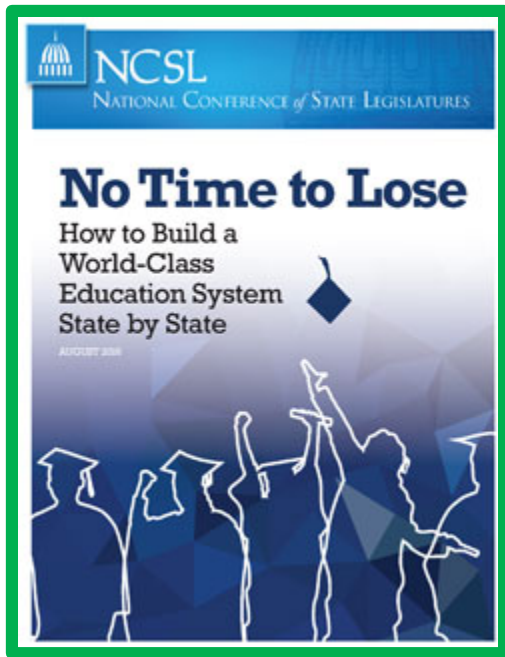

House Schools Systems addressing “No Time to Lose”

1. “Strong Early Education System”

- **Pre-School program for 3yr/4yr offered once per week combined in our kindergarten classroom**
 - **Occupational Therapist**
 - **Physical Therapist**
 - **Speech Language Pathologist**
 - **Vision and Mobility Specialist**

House Schools Systems addressing “No Time to Lose”

2. “Professionalized Teacher Workforce”

❖ 2017-2018

- Contracted with Cooperative Education Services (CES) SITE Team (School Improvement Technical Expertise) for 8 days of free professional development for ELA and math teachers K-12.
- Primary training provided by CES-SITE Team was curriculum review and alignment to CCSS awareness.
- Professional Development also focused on data analysis in PARCC, SBA, Istation, and MAPS to drive instruction.
- NMPED provided a Reading Coach via Reads to Lead funds. Monthly data meetings resulted in greater accountability among elementary teachers. Students were taught how to set goals and track their own progress.

❖ 2018-2019

- CSI Grant Awarded allows us to partner with Instructional Coach
- CES-SITE Team will facilitate full vertical and horizontal alignment of ELA and Math curriculum K-12.
- NextGen Science Standards ongoing training K-12

House Schools Systems addressing “No Time to Lose”

3. “Career and Technical Education Programs”

- House FFA Chapter celebrates 17/18 National FFA Agriscience Fair competitors.
- House BPA Chapter (Business Professionals of America). House Middle School BPA Chapter was established in 17/18 which was inline with the organization National focus.
- House FCCLA Chapter (Family, Career and Community Leaders of America). House student served as 17/18 State President.

House Schools Systems addressing “No Time to Lose”

4. “Comprehensive, Aligned System of Education”

- Facilitated by CES and Instructional Coach, in SY 2018-2019, we will produce guiding documents in ELA and Math. As professionals, we anticipate this process of review and refinement to occur for 12 months, and beyond.
- Teachers will use these documents to guide their ELA and Math instruction in CCSS at the appropriate grade levels K-12.
- Teachers will be accountable to themselves, their students, families and parents. Teachers will also be accountable to each other.
- A comprehensive, aligned system should be attainable with small staff.
 - House Elementary = 4 Teachers
 - House Junior High and House High School = 7 Teachers
 - The Learning Center = 3 Teachers
- 43% of House teachers are Level III and are expected to serve as leaders and role models in our school.
